RECOMMENDATION: Recommend Approval of a Resolution awarding a Contract to Reinders, Inc., Sussex, Wisconsin, for the purchase of one Toro Multi-Pro 5800-G Sprayer and one Triflex 3300 Riding Greensmower for use at Countryside Golf Club and ThunderHawk Golf Club in an amount not to exceed \$83,066.46.

STRATEGIC DIRECTION SUPPORTED: Organizational Sustainability

FINANCIAL DATA: A total of \$83,700.00 was budgeted for FY2018-19 to purchase this sprayer and greensmower. The total cost of \$83,066.46 will be charged to account numbers 80104100-806000 and 83104100-806000.

BACKGROUND: In accordance with the District's Equipment Replacement Schedule, District staff determined that one 1999 Sprayer and one 1996 Triflex Mower are due for replacement. Reinders, Inc. was the successful competitive proposer for the Toro equipment through Omnia Partners, formerly the National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance, pursuant to a request for proposals from the City of Mesa, Arizona. The District is eligible to purchase such Toro equipment, under such proposal, pursuant to the Illinois Governmental Joint Purchasing Act, 30 ILCS 525/1, et seq. The new equipment is expected to be in service for ten years per the district's equipment replacement guidelines.

**A RESOLUTION AWARDING A CONTRACT TO REINDERS, INC.,
FOR TORO GOLF COURSE EQUIPMENT**

WHEREAS, the Lake County Forest Preserve District (the “District”) desires to purchase one Toro Multi-Pro 5800-G Sprayer and one Triflex 3300 Riding Greensmower, or approved equivalents (the “Equipment”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Governmental Joint Purchasing Act, 30 ILCS 525/1, et seq., any governmental unit may purchase personal property, supplies, and services jointly with one or more other governmental units if one of the governmental units has publicly advertised for, and received, competitive bids or proposals and has awarded a contract for such personal property, supplies, and services to the lowest responsible bidder or highest ranking proposer, all in accordance with such Act; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mesa, Arizona, through Omnia Partners, formerly National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance, has publicly advertised for, and received, competitive proposals for the Equipment, including a proposal by The Toro Company; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mesa, Arizona, has awarded a contract to The Toro Company as the highest ranking proposer for the Equipment (the “Mesa Contract”), and the Mesa Contract provides that other units of local government may enter into contracts with The Toro Company on the same terms as provided in the Mesa Contract; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to award a contract for the Equipment to Reinders, Inc., as the agent of The Toro Company on the same terms as provided in the Mesa Contract (the “Contract”);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District, Lake County, Illinois, THAT:

Section 1: Recitals. The recitals set forth above are incorporated as part of this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Award of Contract. The proposals submitted by The Toro Company, in the amount of \$83,066.46 for the Equipment (the “Contract Price”) are hereby accepted and the Contract is hereby awarded to Reinders, Inc., as the agent of The Toro Company.

Section 3. Execution of Contract. The Executive Director of the District is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Contract with Reinders, Inc., in the amount of the Contract Price.

Section 4. Payments. The District Treasurer shall make payments under the Contract only pursuant to and in accordance with the Contract terms.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.
