RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval of a Resolution awarding a Contract for the purchase of one new 2023 Rayco C200 Forestry Mower-Mulcher to Morbark LLC, in the Contract Price of \$345,404.07.

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS SUPPORTED: Conservation; Leadership; Organizational Sustainability

FINANCIAL DATA: Funding for the new Forestry Mower-Mulcher was approved as part of the adopted FY23 budget for \$350,000.00 (account 27644100-804100).

BACKGROUND: The District's 100-year vision includes conserving nature at a landscape-scale. One critical element of this vision is the District's commitment to eradicate buckthorn across 4,000 acres of public and private land, through a collaborative pilot project that seeks to broaden public awareness. In addition to the 3,000 acres that have already been treated to remove buckthorn and other woody invasive species, more than 10,000 acres of District lands are currently invaded and remain untreated. Much of the habitat that requires woody invasive control can be treated with a forestry mower, but there are two constraints to pursing this work by District staff: (1) current equipment has only a 4-foot deck, which limits the area that can be treated, and (2) current equipment is generally best used in lower quality habitat, or its use is limited to periods when frozen ground conditions allow deployment. As a result, much of the mechanical treatment of invasive woody species across the District has been carried out during winter months by contractors with an average bid price of ~\$580/acre.

The Natural Resources Department seeks to purchase a 2023 Rayco C200 Forestry Mower-Mulcher, which has a wider mowing deck than equipment currently available to staff. Natural Resources staff had the opportunity to observe this model in use by one of our current contractors, Central Tree at Van Patten Forest Preserve. The Manager of Landscape Ecology and the Forestry Crew were on site to observe the machine and to learn about the model directly from the operator. We estimate that purchase of this machine will allow Natural Resources crews to control woody invasive species for a fraction of the cost of a contractor, and, because this unit has rubber tracks with a low ground pressure (5.71 psi), will allow nearly year-round opportunities for use. Additionally, this unit can be deployed in a broader range of habitats than we can currently treat either in-house or with contracted labor. Having the capacity in-house and running almost yearround will maximize our efforts in woodland restoration and the eradication of Buckthorn.

A RESOLUTION AWARDING A CONTRACT TO MORBARK LLC, FOR THE PURCHASE OF A FORESTRY MOWER-MULCHER

WHEREAS, the Lake County Forest Preserve District (the "District") desires to purchase one new 2023 Rayco C200 Forestry Mower-Mulcher, or approved equivalent (the "Equipment"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Governmental Joint Purchasing Act, 30 ILCS 525/1, et seq., any governmental unit may purchase personal property, supplies, and services jointly with one or more other governmental units if one of the governmental units has publicly advertised for, and received, competitive, sealed bids or proposals, and has awarded a contract for such personal property, supplies, and services to the lowest responsible bidder or the highest ranking proposer, all in accordance with such Act; and

WHEREAS, Sourcewell has publicly advertised for, and received, competitive proposals for the Equipment, including a proposal by Morbark LLC for the Equipment; and

WHEREAS, Sourcewell has awarded contract #031721-MBI to Morbark LLC as the highest-ranking proposer for the Equipment (the "Sourcewell Contract") and the Sourcewell Contract provides that other units of local government may also enter into contracts with Morbark LLC on the same terms as provided in the Sourcewell Contract; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to award a contract for the Equipment to Morbark LLC on the same terms as provided in the Sourcewell Contract (the "Contract") in a total price equal to \$345,404.07 (the "Contract Price");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District, Lake County, Illinois, **THAT**:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Recitals.</u> The recitals set forth above are incorporated as a part of this Resolution by this reference.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Award of Contract</u>. The proposal submitted by Morbark LLC, in the total amount of the Contract Price is hereby accepted and the Contract is hereby awarded to Morbark LLC.

Section 3. Execution of Contract. The Executive Director of the District is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Contract with Morbark LLC, in the amount of the Contract Price.

<u>Section 4.</u> Payments. The District Treasurer shall make payments under the Contract only pursuant to and in accordance with the Contract terms.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

Canyon Church became grieving site

CALABASAS, Calif. - The pastor stared out toward his attentive congre-gation. He sensed their anger, sadness and confusion.

So Bob Bierkaas, pastor at Church in So Bob Bjerkaas, pastor at Church in the Canyon, delivered a sermon that not only included Bible verses but also addressed his congregation's varying emotions after the sudden death of a Lakers star.

"Kobe Bryant was a man like you and me," Bjerkaas said. "He had ups and deare attentible and weednessee feel."

me," Bjerkaas said, "He had ups and downs, strengths and weaknesses, feelings and hopes.
"But he also had something extraor-

"But he also had something extraor-dinary, and it was a gift from God," Bjerkaas, known as "Pastor Bob," spoke those words Jan, 26, 2020, rough-by 8 K hours after Bryant, his 13-year-old daughter Gianna and seven others died in a helicopter crash, The crash took place on a hillidele past the Santa Monplace on a hillside near the Santa Monca Mountains directly across the street from Bierkass' church

from Bjerkass church.

During an hour-long service, Bjerkass prayed for the nine victims, quoting the book of Ecclesiastes, which details how God helps people deal with both joy and suffering.

And in a 13-minute sermon, Bjerkass sought to comfort arising Brust fans

sought to comfort grieving Bryant fans and his own flock.

"I look back on that and I wonder,
Did I do enough as a local pastor?"
Bjerkaas told USA TODAY Sports nearly

"I always want to do my best

Those who visited Church in the Can von that day believe that Bierkaas did. yon that day believe that hjerkaas did. Nearly 80 fans, nearly all first-time visi-tors, attended the vigil service at the church, which can hold 10 people, After the service, plenty of those fans em-braced and prayed with Bjerkaas. "It was very life changing," sold Irvin Guillermo, 32, of Northridge.

"The fact this happened to Kobe Bryant is such a tragedy, and we wish it

ant is such a trageny, and we have a didn't happen.
"But Pastor Bob spoke to me and made me realize that death isn't something we should fear. The way he described it was that Kobe is at peace.
"That incrited me and motivated me

That inspired me and motivated me to enjoy every moment of my life,"

Watching as the tragedy unfolded

Bjerkaas offered such perspective nearly nine hours after first processing the tragedy. While teaching a Sunday school class around 9:45 a.m., Bjerkaas heard the sound of a low-lighing helicopter fol-lowed by a loud thump. Bjerkaas thought nothing of it. Helicopters and planes By Groundth core; Calabases to planes fly frequently over Calabasas to connect to the Burbank and LAX air-

ports,
Elizabeth Howland Forrest, a mem-ber of the church, was much more con-cerned. While driving from Santa Monica, she marveled at the low-flying helicopter that she followed west along In-terstate 101. She then lost sight of it after exiting the freeway and eventually parking at the church. As she finished applying her makeup, Howland Forrest saw the hellcopter again in her rearview

Then she saw the helicopter crash into the hillside behind the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District building across from the church. She saw smoke mediately. "I waited awhile," Howland Forrest

said, "I was concerned what the danger might be."

As the 10:45 service began inside the

church, Howland Forrest stayed outside to help accommodate arrivals of police, firemen, reporters and onlookers. One TV reporter relayed the news to How-TV reporter relayed the news to How-land Forrest that Kobe and Gianna Bry-ant were among the passengers. Soon enough, Bryant's chauffeur arrived to speak to authorities. "He was speechless," Howland For-rest said of Bryant's chauffeur. "He was

completely in grief and found it unbelievable."

So Howland Forrest passed along a note to alert Bjerkaas about the news of Bryant and his daughter. Since their Identities were not yet verified, Bjerkaas stayed quiet. But he centered his sermon on the book of Job, which involves a righteous man experiencing tragedy and how he dealt with it, Bjerkaas told and now he deatt with it. Bjerkaas toid his congregation the helicopter crash "reminded us that life is not a guaranteed thing."

A church member then interrupted and announced that Kobe and Gianna Proport were appeared.

Bryant were among the victims,

"It was very, very distressing," Bjer-kaas said. "I have some real die-hard

kaas said. "I have some real die-nard Lakers fans in my congregation. They were pretty shook."
So were the 200 grieving fans whom Bjerkaas said arrived within a half hour after his sermon. By then the sheriff's department blocked off road access at checkpoints near the crash site. That included the clurch's lectring on the corcluded the church's location on the corner of Las Virgenes Road and Willow Glen Street. Mourners and reporters soon filled the sidewalks.

soon filled the sidewalks.
Suddenly, Church in the Canyon became the gathering place to grieve.
"We didn't have a plan; we didn't have
supplies," bjerkaas said, "All we had was
a whole bunch of coffee and a whole
bunch of Goffee and a whole bunch of coffee cups.

A safe haven for mourning fans

Through the day, Blerkaas estimated the church served about 400 cups of coffee. He allowed fans to use the church bathroom. The church became more than just a free coffee shop.

Blerkaas empathized with those grieving. After seeing one distressed

grieving. Alter seeing one distressed Bryant fan smoking marijuana on church property, Bjerkaas respectfully confronted him about tossing it before they prayed together. "Pastor Bob was remarkable," How-land Forrest said, "He had a humble heart with recognizing that for all the

neart with recognizing that for an the people coming there, it was not a convenient location. They were tired. They were thirsty. And there wasn't anything around for them. His desire was for people to feel comfortable, welcomed, be able to have a place to rest if they needed, He was 100% consistent 100% of the time."

Although he admired Bryant, Blerkaas did not have a personal connection to the Lakers' star, He never met the Lakers' star.

Bjerkaas, who was born in Columbia, Maryland, grew up rooting for the Washington Bullets, But after Church In the Canyon hird

him as pastor in 2007, Bjerkaas quickly learned what Bryant meant to LA. Most of his congregation are Lakers fans. One of his administrative assistants has Bryant posters plastered all over her office walls.

Bryant's impact did not fully register, however, until his death. "What struck me was how close the

connection Kobe Bryant had with his fans." Blerkaas said.

"A lot of them said, 'I thought of him as an older brother.' Or they said watching him go through his issues helped me

Opening the church

That fateful day on Jan. 26, 2020. That lateful day on Jan, 26, 2020, marked the beginning of a tragic year. For the next week, Bjerkans and his wife held impromptu gatherings for fans at the crash site. Bjerkans, who also coaches youth lacrosse, made yellow street signs and his players held them in the nelghborhood to direct visitors to the church.

Their ministry soon ended abruptly. Their ministry soon ended abruptly.

On March 22, Church in the Canyon closed because of the coronavirus outbreak, Bjerkaas prerecorded services to post on YouTube.

The church received approval to hold outdoor services in August, but by January Indoor, services were allowed at

uary indoor services were allowed at smaller capacity. The church has re-quired attendees to take temperature

quired attendees to take temperature checks, follow social distancing rules and bring their own Bible and take prepackaged Communion.

Unlike the frenetic scene during last year's tragedy, roads are no longer blocked off and there are no markings around the crash site. Unlike last year, littled case will be a be able to give the control of the contr Bjerkaas will not be able to give out a

Bjerkaas will not be able to give out a cup of coffee, say a prayer or deliver a semon to all interested Bryant fans.

"This year in general has taught us really to think that life is a fragile and precious thing," Bjerkaas said. "Things can change in a moment."

Budweiser is foregoing its annual Super Bowl commercial slot for the fitting in 37 years, joining fellow Juggernauts Coke, Hyundai and Pepsi in skip-

ping this year's Super Bowl broadcast amid the financial uncertainty of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The beer brand said in a news release

The beer brand said in a news release that instead of paying to air a Super Bowl ad, it will instead be "reallocating the media investment" to raise awareness about the COVID-19 vaccine throughout the year, in partnership with the Ad Council year, in partnership with the Ad Council.

"Like everyone else, we are eager to "Like everyone else, we are eager to get people hack together, reopen restau-rants and bars, and be able to gather to cheers with friends and family," Bud-weiser vice president of marketing Monica Rustgi said in a statement. "To do this, and to bring consumers back into neighborhood bars and restaurants that were hit exceptionally hard by the pandemic, we're stepping in to support critical awareness of the COVID-19 vac-

According to the news release, Bud-weiser plans to donate some of its ad-vertising airtime throughout 2021 to the Ad Council and COVID Collaborative, a coalition of experts in health, education and the economy. Clarissa Dickinson, a spokesperson for Budweiser, called it "a multimillion-dollar commitment

Although Budweiser is skipping this year's television broadcast, it will run a 90-second ad titled "Bigger Picture" on digital platforms before and during the

Super Bowl. The commercial is narrated by actress Rashida Jones. Bud Light, another Anheuser-Busch

brand, is still expected to air an ad during the game,
The absence of Budwelser - and fel-

low Super Bowl regulars Coke, Hyundai and Pepsi – will leave this year's broad-cast without several of the perennial contenders in USA TODAY's Ad Meter, which ranks Super Bowl commercials by consumer rating.

All four companies framed the move as a matter of strategy and resource al-location amid the pandemic, which has led to job losses and budget cuts across industrias
